Identification of Special Educational Needs

At different times in their school life, a child or young person may have a Special Educational Need.

We identify children as having Special Educational Needs if they show that they have a significant difficulty in learning than others the same age or a disability, which prevents or hinders their learning.

If you have any concerns regarding your child's progress, then please speak to your child's class teacher.

Support for Special Educational Needs

Through Assertive Mentoring the children are encouraged to take an active role in their own learning.

We will provide extra help for your child using the four stage process: Assess, Plan, Do and Review. (See SEN Policy for details)

We provide high quality class teaching, help from teaching assistants and a range of interventions.

Inclusion & Accessibility

We make sure all pupils have equal access to the curriculum and activities outside the classroom including clubs and trips. The school building is fully accessible to all.

Working Together

We have clear communication between teachers, children with SEN, parents of SEN children and outside agencies.

We sometimes get advice and support from other professionals, with the parent's consent: Speech & Language Therapy services, Occupational Therapist, Physiotherapist, an Advisory Support Teacher or Educational Psychologist or health services such as a Paediatrician.

Transition

Joining our school- If your child has Special Educational Needs we will work closely with parents, previous setting, Nursery or School to make careful arrangements for your child.

New classes- During the Summer Term class teachers share information about each child's needs and support and progress made

Moving to High School- During the Summer Term of Year 6 information is shared with each child's High School by our SENCO and/or class teacher.
